LOTTERY RETAILER ACCOUNTABILITY



You've been approved to allow minors, accompanied with a parent or guardian, in your liquor primary establishment until 10pm

It is important for you and your staff to understand the following:

- It is illegal to sell lottery products to anyone under the age of 19-years-old.
- Doing so may result in:
 - **A \$288 fine** under the Offence Act, or an administrative **fine from the Independent Gaming Control Office (IGCO) of up to \$5000**
 - **Suspension or cancellation** of your gaming registration/licence
 - All of the above



The Self-Service Terminals (SSTs) and Pull Tab Vending Machines (PTVMs) in your establishment do not require age verification in order to operate. **It is you and your staff's responsibility to ensure that minors do not use those machines.**

PREVENTING THE SALE OF LOTTERY TO MINORS – Ask for ID

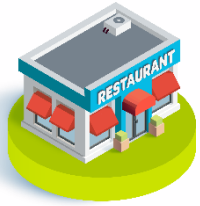


If anyone who looks under the age of 25-years-old is attempting to make a lottery purchase from a SST or PTVM, follow these steps:

1. **Ask for Identification**
2. **If they are unable to provide identification or if their identification proves they are underage, return them to their parent or guardian**
3. **If they are not accompanied by a parent or guardian, they should be asked to leave immediately**

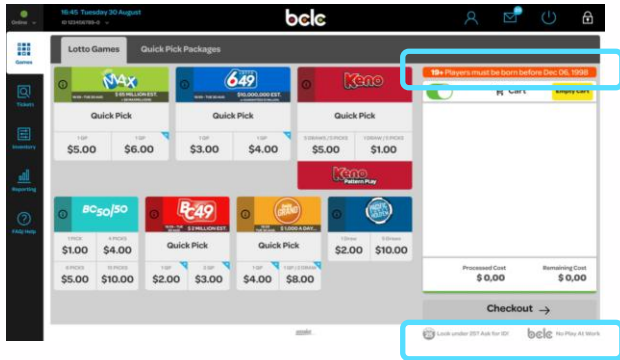


The same rules apply if customers attempt to purchase lottery at the bar via the Lottery Terminal.

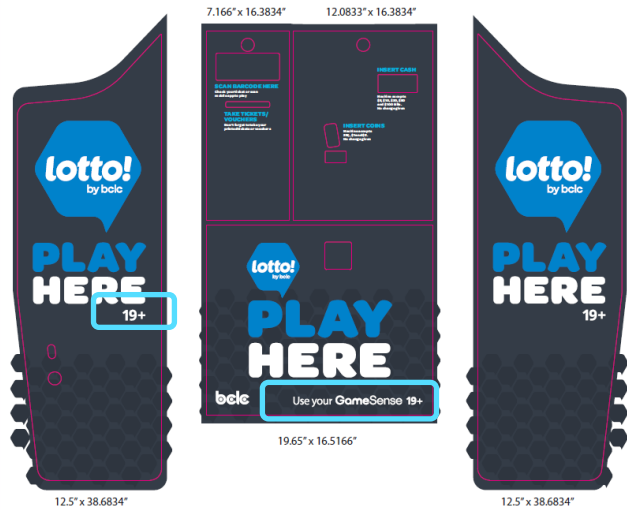


The following items are the standard POS and visuals for HN and are designed to help you prevent the sale of lottery to minors:
